



Talbot County Community Center & Ice Rink 2020-21 Ice Skating Season COVID-19 Guidelines

We are open with limited capacity and operating with modified schedules and revised policies following the CDC, State of Maryland, Talbot County, and USA Hockey and ISI guidelines.

- All participants and attendees (ice skaters, coaches, players, parents, spectators, referees, etc.) must conduct a self-health assessment before each session or program. *Do not attend if you do not feel well, have a cough or fever, or have been in contact with anyone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.*
- ALL individuals must wear a mask at all times when in the building, on and off the ice, unless authorized by Talbot County Community Center Management.
- Wash hands with soap and water frequently. Hand sanitizing stations are located throughout the facility.
- Cover cough and sneezes. Avoid touching your face.
- Physical Distance (6 ft) whenever possible.
- Patrons are asked to arrive no more than 15 minutes prior to scheduled activity and leave immediately following the activity. No congregating on or off the ice.
- Parents/guardians must supervise children at all times to help ensure guidelines are being met. Non-skating siblings may enter with a parent but must wear a mask and remain with the parent at all times. No horseplay or running allowed.
- Public Skate sessions have a capacity of 150 patrons (skaters and non-skaters). No re-admittance during public skating sessions.
- Rental skates will be available and will be disinfected after each use. Skating aids will not be available.
- Learn-to-Skate and Jamie Webb Hockey Lessons have a capacity of 30 students per lesson.
- Registration Forms and the TCPR COVID-19 waiver must be completed before participant can participate in the Learn-to-Skate or Jamie Webb Hockey Lessons. The form and waiver can be returned to us via email or dropped off during our regular office hours (Monday-Friday, 8AM-4:30PM).
- Entrance and exit to the building for Learn-to-Skate, Jamie Webb Hockey, Talbot Figure Skating Team, Room Rentals, and Public Skate sessions will be through the main front doors on the left of the community center.
- Easton Ice Hawks players, coaches, managers, and score keepers will enter and exit through the hockey entrance of the building. All other parents, family members, and spectators will enter through the main doors or the community center.
- Water fountain and vending machines are not available during the initial phases of the re-opening and the Snack Bar will be closed the season. No outside food permitted.
- Capacity limits and guidelines are guided by Talbot County and the State of Maryland and are subject to change.
